HOW TO JOIN THE TEAM:

STEP 1: EXPRESS INTEREST

You have an interest in serving God by loving students but are unsure as to where you can help. We have lots of opportunities to get you involved and will talk this through with you. Let us know your interests and passions and we will help you take the next step.

STEP 2: FILL OUT THE STUDENT MINISTRY LEADER APPLICATION PACKET

This is the packet you are reading right now. It gives an overview of our ministry and highlights the expectations we have of leaders. This application was developed to gain information from you in order to enhance our ability to set you up for success in serving. It is lengthy, but we take seriously our responsibility to put together an effective team. Be sure to turn in a signed application, Student Ministry Code of Conduct and Standards of Behavior form, as well as a signed Background Check Authorization form (We will need a new one if you have already signed one from a previous serving opportunity at CCV in the past). Please turn this all in to any of our Student Ministry staff members.

STEP 3: CONTACT BY STUDENTS STAFF

Once we have your application turned in we will set up a time to meet with you. This is an opportunity for us to meet with you in order to connect and hear your story and desire to be involved in Student Ministries. It is also a time for you to ask questions about this packet, about the ministry, and anything you want to know about Students. We will also give you a more detailed overview of the ministry and help you choose a time to visit and observe one of our services.

STEP 4: THE "STARTER KIT"

This is a kit we created just for you. It will help you get started in your journey of serving students. This kit will give a better understanding of our expectations for leaders and some great training to help you become a better leader. Please review all the information on this flash drive.

STEP 5: PRAYERFULLY CONSIDER YOUR COMMITMENT

We want you to take time to pray and think through this commitment. We

also encourage you to seek the counsel of family and friends regarding your serving commitment.

STEP 6: OBSERVE SERVICES

This is a good opportunity to get a better feel for the ministry. You will shadow one of our core volunteers on your first couple of visits. This will give you the chance to meet students and other leaders, see our services, as well as formulate questions for future meetings.

STEP 7: COMMUNICATE YOUR COMMITMENT

After you have decided you want to make a commitment, give us a call, text or email and we will meet with you again to talk about your commitment. We are excited to hear what God has shown you through this process. Now is the exciting part as we get to serve alongside you as we reach our vision for Students ministry.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION TO THINK ABOUT

For most adults, investing into the next generation can be somewhat intimidating. But when we really get down to it, it's not as hard as we make it out to be. Time and time again, we have heard the same misconceptions and, unfortunately, these misconceptions prevent amazing men and women from getting involved in ministry and being the difference in the life of a student. Students need adults who care about them, have time for them and will point them to Jesus.

COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS...

Here are a few:

- I must be young and hip
- I must have adequate Bible training
- I must be a perfect example of a Christian
- I must be able to act like one of the students
- I must have plenty of free time
- I must know everything about the latest youth culture
- I must be wild, crazy, and dynamic
- I must be liked by all students

It is normal for us to question our skills and abilities as we wonder if we will be able to relate to the students, but know this: your confidence will grow the more you are around students and you'll see how God can use normal, inadequate people (like me and you) to do great things. We do not want you to miss out on this incredible opportunity to invest in the next generation as a result of a

common misconception.

WHAT STUDENTS NEED

Adults who will: remember their name, go into their world, pray for them and with them, laugh with them and at themselves, take initiative to spend time with them outside of church, believe in them and love Jesus authentically in front of them. Simply put, students need adults who care about them, have time for them and will point them to Jesus. One person can't be all things to all the students...young, old, crazy, wise, funny, sociable, quiet, etc. But you can be the one person to help a student take a step forward in their faith journey.

PROGRAMS AND VALUES

OUR VISION:

To be a place where students are challenged to become fully devoted followers of Jesus. Leading them to share his love in their home, school and beyond.

CORE VERSE:

As for me, I would seek God, and to God I would commit my cause. 9 He does great things and unsearchable, marvelous things without number. (Job 5: 8-9 NRSV)

PROGRAMS:

- Wednesday nights: 7th – 12th come together for one big night of worship, teaching and community.
- Sunday mornings: JR High program at 10am in room 205. This is a place for our 7th-8th graders to get connected to our ministry so we can invite them to Wednesday nights.
- Growth Group: This is everything in our ministry. We start with a ROOTED group and then become a growth group. This is a group of 8-12 students, same age and gender who come together each week to find accountability and encouragement while doing life together.
- Safety team: This team helps out at Student Ministry worship services on Wednesday nights. Safety is a top priority for Students and we want to ensure parents and students that our services are a safe place.

OUR RELATIONAL VALUES

These are the 6 VALUES that every leader should hold as important and strive to embody. As relational leaders we must...

1. Be a Spiritual Leader

- FULLY DEVOTED FOLLOWER: Spends time with God daily, lives in community with other believers, practices generosity, serves in their area of giftedness and invests in their one life
- PURSUE HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS: Actively seeks Godly friendships & relationships
- FAITHFUL: Attend a weekend service at CCV
- MODEL: Actively pursuing accountability in your life

2. Take Ownership

- Know WHO your students are: their name, school, family, hobbies, etc.
- Know WHERE they are struggling: spend more time listening than talking
- Know WHAT truth they need to hear: discern and pray for God's leading
- Know WHEN they need to be challenged: knowing them will help you discern opportunities to influence and point them to Jesus
- Know WHY someone missed Wednesday night: this is huge because it shows students you care and that you noticed
- Know THEM: follow up, come through with what you said you would do. After a big night of prayer or a step forward in faith find time to follow up with them before the next service

3. Member of the SHIFT Team

- Committed to SHIFT values & vision
- Supportive of SHIFT leadership
- Marketing SHIFT events and programs
- Represent our ministry to parents
- Protect our ministry: If you see an adult you do not recognize on Wednesday, please engage them in conversation and make sure they are part of the team. If they are not, direct them to talk to a pastor to get involved

4. Be Administrative

- Good communication is key with parents & students
- Check-in with SHIFT staff through Facebook leader page, email or phone
- Create tools such as calendar reminders to keep in touch with your students
- Develop detailed plans to spend time with students outside of Wednesdays
- Read and engage in SHIFT weekly Facebook post & emails. Please comment & email back. Let the staff know how you can help

5. The Facilitator and Teacher (growth & ROOTED group leaders)

- Prepare and teach the study in your small group
- Provide opportunities for students to dive into God's Word
- Challenge students to take the next spiritual step
- Allow students to talk, share and lead discussions

6. Relationally-Minded

- Be an encourager
- Be involved in student's lives. Spend time with them outside of church

CCV BELIEF STATEMENT:

STUDENT MINISTRIES CODE OF CONDUCT AND STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR

We desire for Student Ministries services and events to not only be incredibly fun, but safe as well. For your own personal journey, safety, and the safety of others, we ask that all leaders abide by this Code of Conduct and Standards of Behavior while participating in ministry events. Leaders who violate the Code of Conduct or Standards of Behavior will be subject to a process of restoration and taking a season off from serving.

LEADERSHIP POLICIES / EXPECTATIONS:

LIFESTYLE

- The Student volunteer staff is called to set an example for our students of what it means to be godly men and women. We are asked to do so by living above reproach according to a Biblical standard and by lifting up the name of God, lifting up others, and lifting up the ministry/church leadership.

REPORTING RESPONSIBILITIES

- Student leaders are required to report to their appropriate Student Pastor on the same day they have reasonable suspicion or knowledge that a student has been the victim of child abuse, that a student is thinking of or talking seriously about suicide, or that a person poses a serious danger of violence to another person. If the student is in imminent danger, the Student staff person will act immediately to protect the life of the student, and this may include contacting parents, police or child protective services.

EXPECTATIONS (with students of opposite sex)

We expect appropriate behavior of pastors and volunteer leaders in ministering to students of the opposite sex. It is extremely important that the ministry to students at CCV be above reproach. The following policies are mandatory for being a part of Students Ministry:

- Leaders will not engage in an ongoing helping relationship with a student of the opposite sex. This includes engaging in conversation over social media, text, phone or any form of communication. Students who have needs will be directed to staff and volunteers of the same sex of the student. Furthermore, staff and

volunteers leaders will not meet one on one with a student of the opposite sex.

- Leaders will not provide transportation for an individual student of the opposite sex. Case in point: if a male volunteer is required to take home a female student and two male students, he will take the female student home first or second, not last.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR

1. No alcohol, drugs, or tobacco permitted [Any possession, using, buying, or distributing of an illegal or controlled substance or alcohol on church property or during a Next Gen Ministries event will not be tolerated and parents will be informed and appropriate authorities will be notified].

2. Alcohol policy for volunteer leaders is this: we ask all volunteers leaders who are 21 or over be mindful while drinking in public within a 15 mile radius of the church. We do not tolerate drinking of anyone under 21 and according to Ephesians 5:18 we will not tolerate any volunteer leader getting drunk.

3. Participation with students is expected. Wednesday nights is designed for students, do not be outside on the patio during service time. From 6:40-9:15pm you are expected to be with students and not hanging out with other adults.

4. Dating policy for Volunteer leaders is: We expect any volunteer leader to understand they are on leadership and with leadership comes a higher expectation in your relationships. Therefore, we follow 2 Corinthians 6:14 and expect that any non-married volunteer leader would date someone who is a Christian and of "equal yoking." Furthermore, we expect a high level of purity in non-married dating relationships as addressed in Hebrews 13:4. Non-married leaders are not engaging in sexual activity outside of marriage.

5. Respect for other volunteers and staff. You will be a raving fan of the Student Ministry and its team publically. Any concern or question you have will be brought to one of the staff members privately.

6. Respect for property of CCV. You will hold the CCV campus in high regard and do your part to keep it looking its best.

7. Be on time to leader meetings, events and any Student event.

8. No fighting, weapons, fireworks, explosives, or lighters on Wednesday nights. If a student brings these items or engages in these activities they are to be pulled aside and the parent contacted.

9. Be aware of what you post or have posted on social media. This is a great way to connect with students, but we ask that you understand students will find you, follow you and emulate you based on social media. Before you start serving it is a good idea to look through your social media profiles and clean up any content that would go against Colossians 3:16-17. Also do not have private conversations with students of opposite sex on social media.

10. Volunteer leaders should in no manner initiate, promote, encourage, or participate in any activity that would lead to or expose nudity.

11. Volunteer leaders should in no manner initiate, promote, encourage, or allow students or themselves to engage in any horseplay, jokes, hazing or ridicule, which contains sexual/homosexual connotations. In the same way, they should

not engage in any jokes or ridicule that is degrading or causing harm to another (i.e., "atomic sit-ups", "wedgies", "swirlies," etc.).

12. Volunteer leaders need to be cautious with physical touch with students and how it might: a) be construed by the individual, and b) be viewed as inappropriate by others surrounding them.

RED FLAGS

The Red Flag policy was created in an effort to catch behavior before it places someone at risk. Our Student Ministries considers any sort of behavior by students, volunteer leaders or staff that puts others at risk physically, emotionally, or spiritually to be a "Red Flag." Red Flags are not tolerated within our ministries, and concerns should be communicated to a Pastor.

It is a red flag if a student, staff, adult, or some older person who has authority or power in one's life behaves in the following way:

- Driving excessively fast, recklessly or illegally.
- Spending excessive time with one student, while excluding others.
- Spending time in a student's room, or other private place, with the door locked or blinds closed.
- Any participation in activity that requires you or students to take their clothes off (i.e. skinny-dipping, strip poker, streaking, photography).
- Initiating any physical touching that makes someone feel uncomfortable, especially if you persist after they express their discomfort.
- Any horseplay or joking in a homosexual or sexual way.
- Using your physical power to control someone in such a way that they feel threatened or in pain.
- Using, purchasing, or encouraging the use or purchase of any illegal substances.
- Being deceitful or resistant in communication with parents and/or disregarding parental authority.
- Using ridicule, put downs, or hazing tactics that diminish, embarrass, or demoralize someone as a person.
- Encouraging someone to break the law (i.e. trespassing, vandalism, theft).

I have read and will support and uphold the Code of Conduct and Standards of Behavior of Christ's Church of the Valley. I acknowledge that violation of the Code of Conduct and Standards of Behavior will result in discipline from the ministry, including being sent home from an event and restriction from further activities.
